HOW YOUR care is delivered

Your care team

Your multidisciplinary care team is made up of health care experts from both Wayne County Hospital (WCH) and Cancer Treatment Centers of America® (CTCA), Chicago collaborating to design and deliver a cancer care plan tailored to you and your individual needs. If you were referred to WCH from another clinician, he or she will also be a part of your team, continuing to play a key role in your overall health and well-being.



Telemedicine

Telemedicine allows health care professionals to provide consultations that support or add to the treatment plan at a distance using telecommunications technology.

How telemedicine is delivered

The WCH/CTCAC Oncology Telemedicine Coordinated Care Program connects CTCA Chicago medical oncologists and other health care professionals with patients at WCH, using a secure system that includes a TV monitor and camera, allowing for access to comprehensive, personalized cancer care close to home.

Benefits of telemedicine

- Immediate access to medical specialists
- Ability to stay closer to family and local support systems
- Less time off work
- Less time in hospital setting
- Less time in the waiting room
- Reduced transportation time or costs

You'll first meet with your providers at WCH to understand how the program may fit your needs and to begin the process.




Once you decide to move forward with your cancer care, your WCH providers will share your medical records, including imaging and other important health information, with your CTCA Chicago oncologist.



Your first visit will be scheduled as an in-person appointment at the CTCA Chicago hospital located in Zion, Illinois. During this one- to three-day evaluation, you'll meet with your CTCA Chicago oncologist and care team and undergo any additional testing that may be required to better determine your treatment plan. If appropriate, your oncologist may suggest that you begin your treatment during this visit. Your WCH and CTCA Chicago care teams will guide you in what to expect. Your CTCA Chicago scheduling team may be able to assist in scheduling your travel and/or overnight accommodations.



It's important to note that once you and your CTCA Chicago oncologist choose a treatment plan, your WCH clinician and CTCA Chicago oncologist will work together to manage your care.



After returning home, you'll then be scheduled for regular appointments at Wayne County Hospital. During these visits, you and your WCH clinician will meet with your CTCA Chicago oncologist using telemedicine technology to discuss your treatment status, make adjustments as needed, address your questions and go over any next steps.



Depending on your treatment plan, you may be required to have in-person visits and procedures from time to time at the CTCA Chicago hospital. Other treatments, such as some chemotherapies, may be delivered at Wayne County Hospital. Your CTCA Chicago scheduling team may be able to assist in scheduling your travel and/or overnight accommodations for in-person visits.
